A few club members are attending the HCCA national meeting in Visalia. Watch for a report and photos in next month's newsletter. Should be a fun trip.





due to the breathable material in which hats were constructed, and the brim offering protection from the sun. The straw hats were made from sennit-a type of braided cord from straw, hemp, or similar fibers. The term BOATER was assigned to the straw hat due to the growing popularity of young men seen rowing down the river wearing their Boaters or straw hats!

Boaters were eventually worn by women and men in the 1900's when dressed in casual clothing. Summer outings to a picnic, tennis court, or seaside provided one with the


opportunity to wear their BOATER! When I picture a dashing young man wearing a boater, a certain Skagit guy comes to mind. HMMM? Do you know who that is?
